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If the agenda were a feather and the Delegate of Nigeria an arrow, today, at HFS MUN's UNGA, the feather would be slit down the middle, with Nigeria emerging as the victor. "The people of Yemen are not just data and statistics, but human beings with feelings. It is our duty to ensure their voices are heard and their problems alleviated," proclaimed the Delegate of South Korea, charging into the committee like a warrior on a white horse.

The Delegate of Iran inaugurated the tradition of getting barred after he comically raised Afghanistan's placard instead of his own. Germany, much like a commander at war, rallied the delegates to victory by finally proposing a solution, recommending the establishment of an independent UNHRC commission to address the humanitarian violations in the affected region.



little to no members. Iran was nonchalant about the ordeal, stating, "It does not bother me."


Yemen had some less-than-flattering things to say about the opposite bloc(pro-iran), calling them


The weak response was "We are making scientists investigate this disease", to which he got slammed by the journalists. The Silencer had been silenced.




The USA questioned the presence of Australia when he said, "I don't know what Australia is doing here given that their only relevance to biowarfare is kangaroos.".
