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OPENING CEREMONY

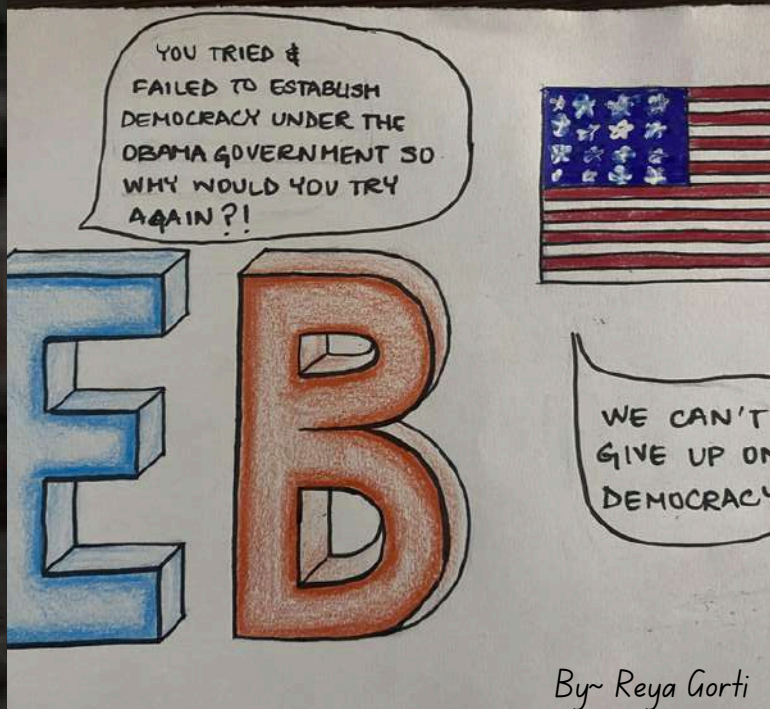

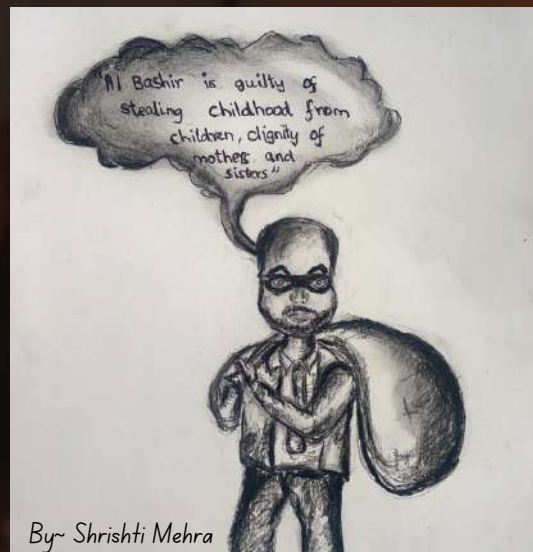

Genocide without Jews



If the UNSC committee was a game of cards, then it began with the participants keeping their cards close to them, only to evolve into a barroom gunfight. Early attempts by the delegate Uganda to enter into GSL were rebuked by the EB due to his untucked shirt. On his return, he advised the committee to help the people of Darfur and condemned the genocide in the region.

Solutions advised by former speakers were quickly forced underground when the delegate of Sudan set the committee ablaze by taking shots against the United Nations Security Council-

“We would like to begin our speech by condemning the United Nations Security Council on the punitive actions it has taken regarding the conflict and its incompetency...”.Not

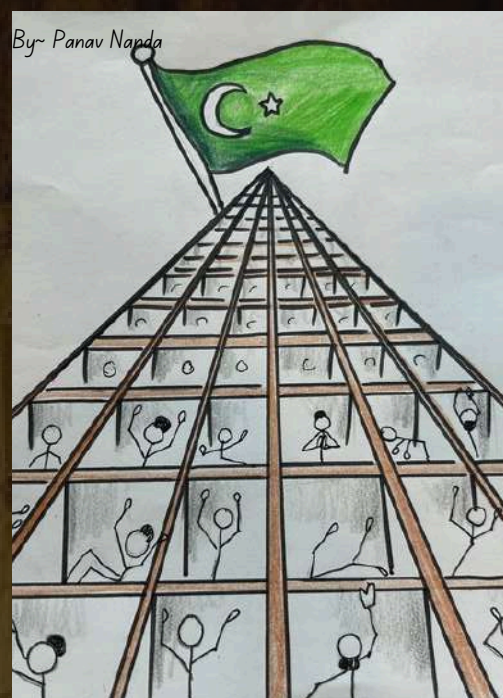
BIBLE OF BRAIN ROT AND BROWNIES

“If the two-state solution is not passed, war will happen and justice will be served!” With this awakening statement, the delegate of the Republic of Ghana expressed their stance on the UNHRC agenda on day one. 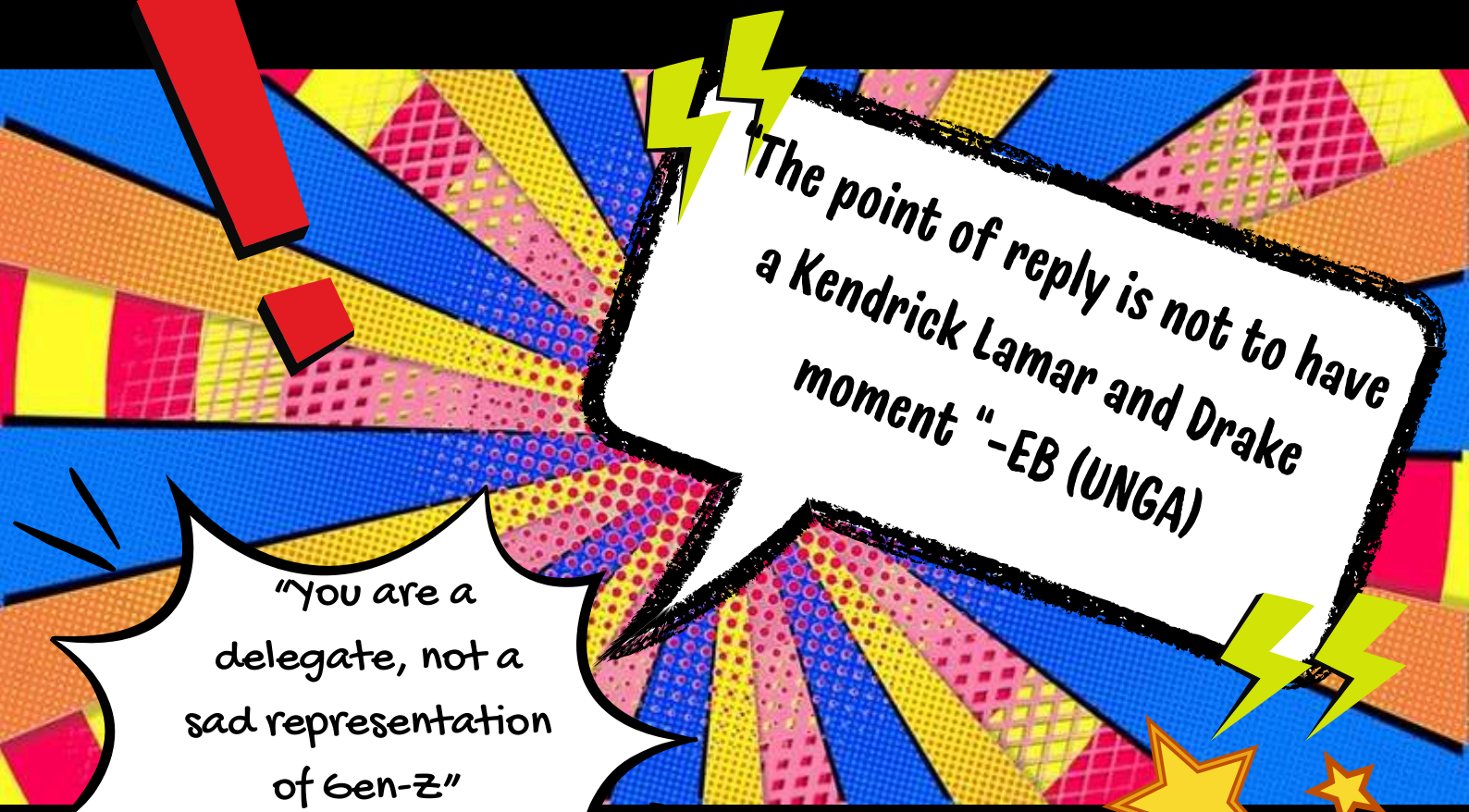

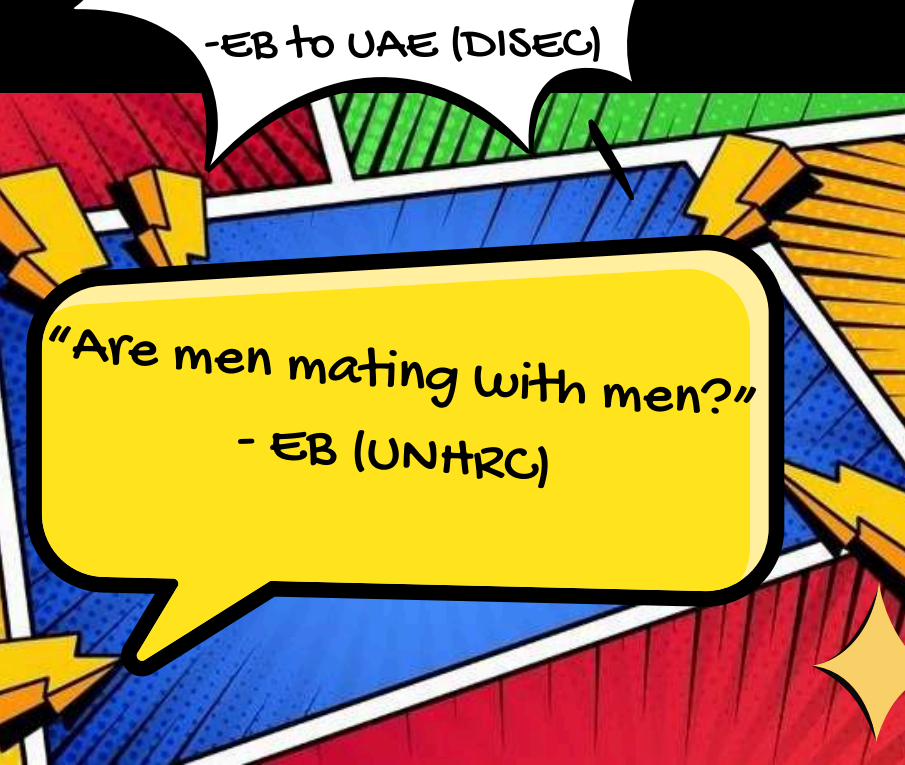

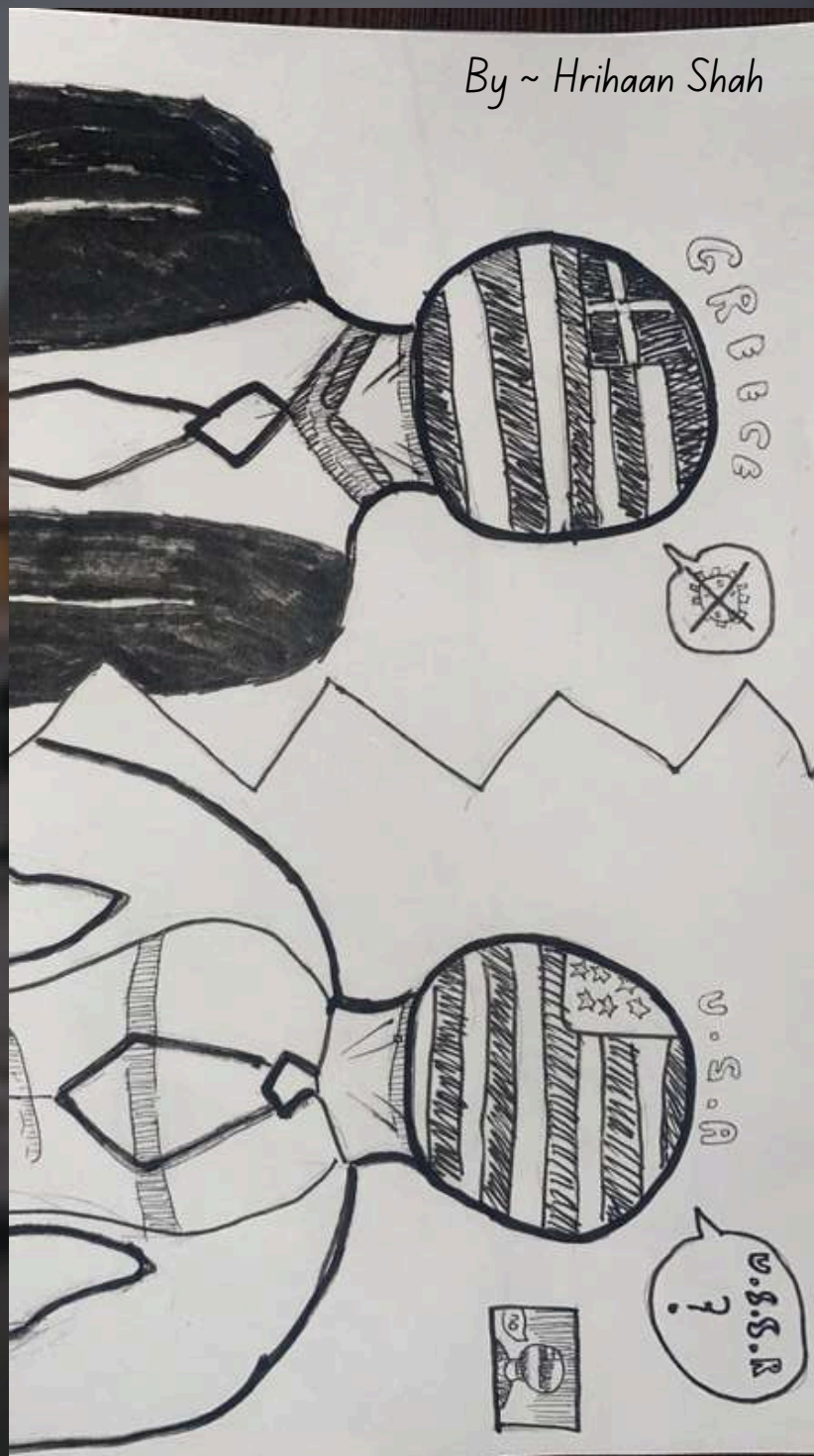
WHO'S DONE IT?

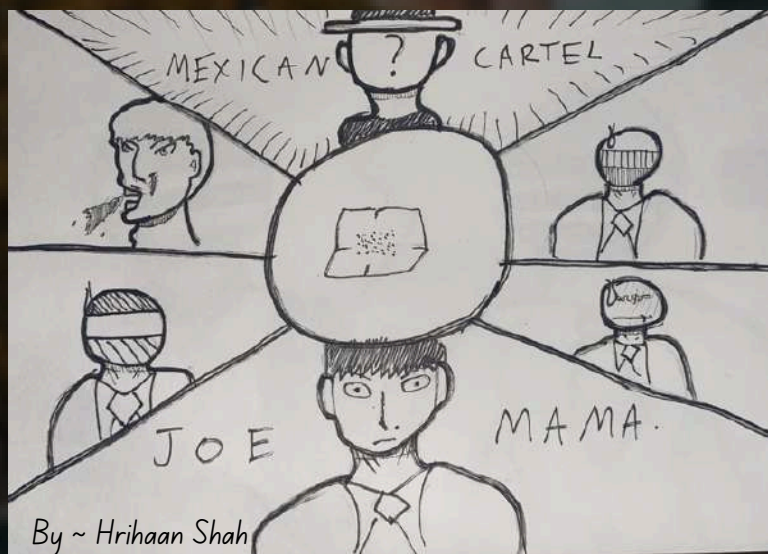

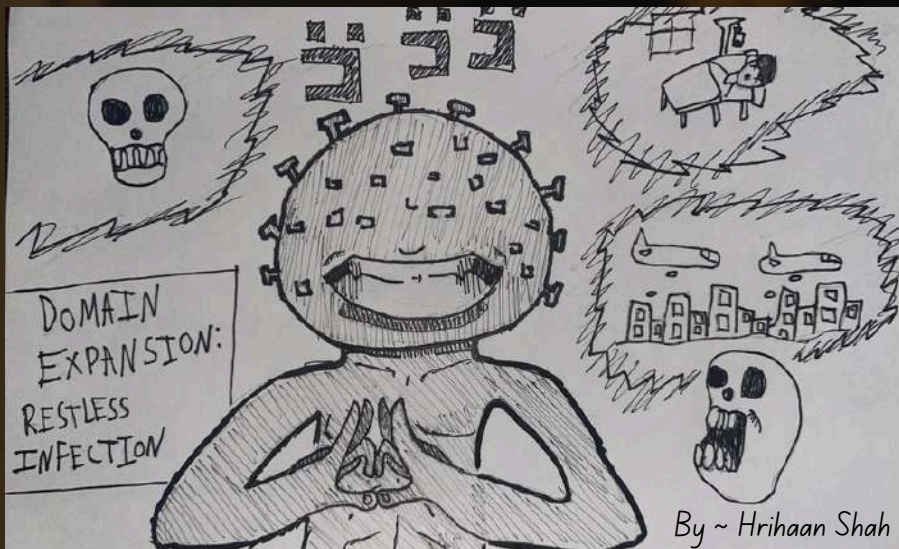

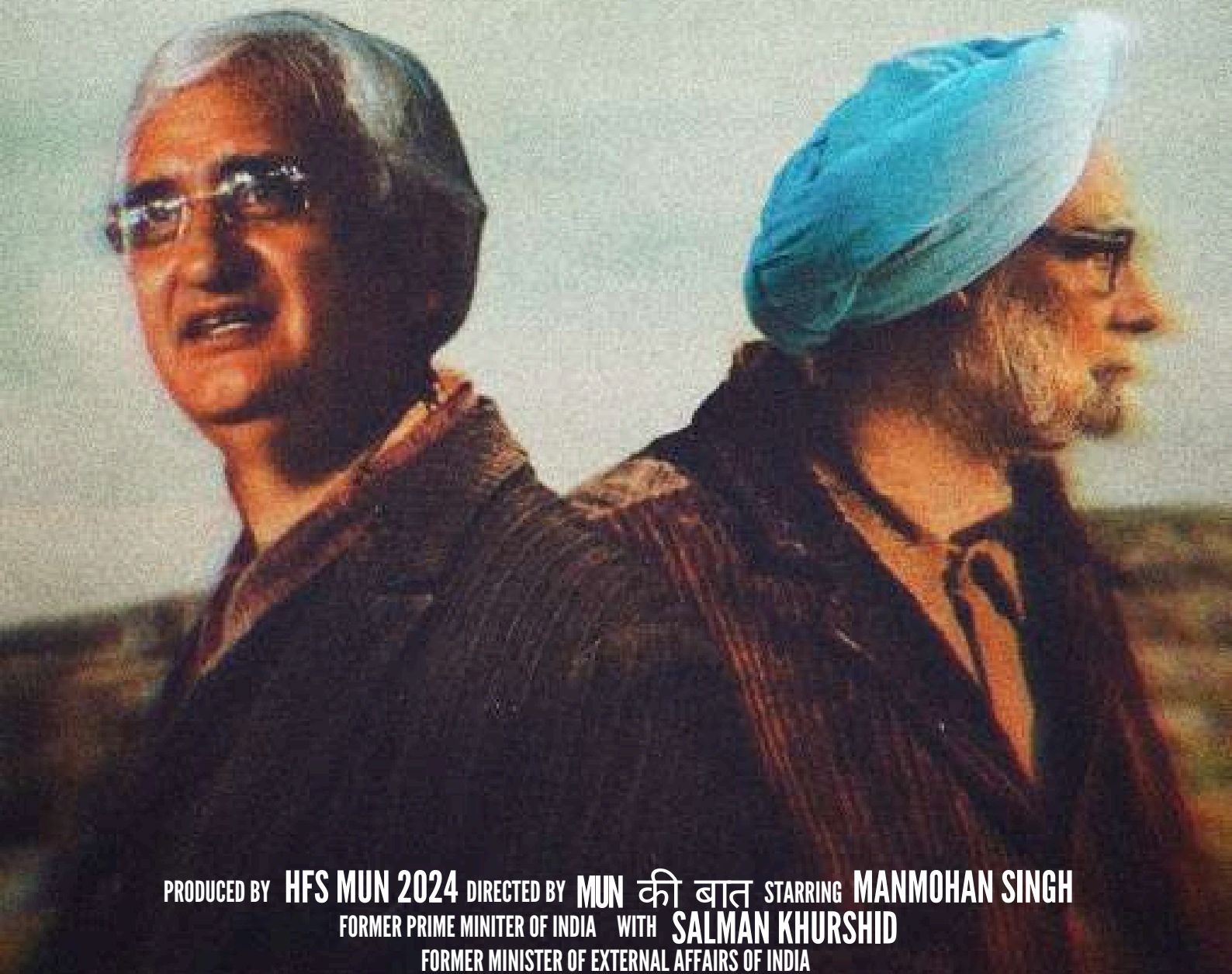
As the word war raged on, the delegates worked together to find probable solutions for this grave and urgent crisis. The question may be subsided, but not forgotten: WHO's done it after all?

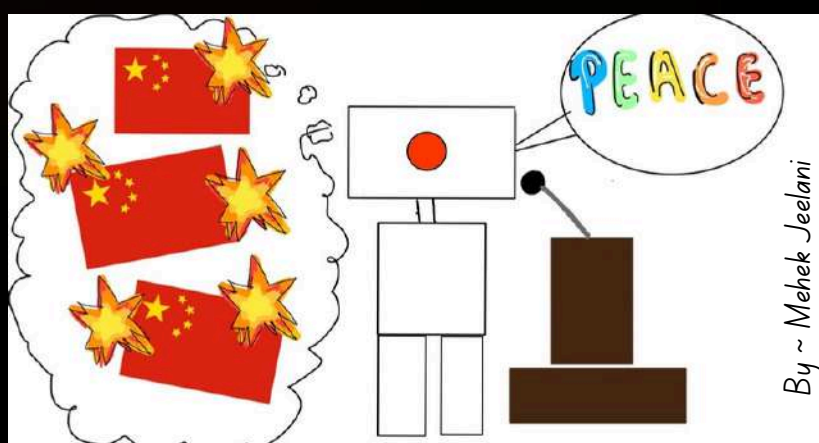

The delegate of USSR stated, *“Not a single nation supports Japan, they stand no chance.”* USA added, *“Japan has been exposed, what will they do now?”* And thus, one by one, all the countries united against Japan. As the skies cleared, Japan felt increasingly isolated and criticised by each country. Cornered to the edge, the delegate of Japan threw themselves overboard the ship, exiting the League of Nations entirely, resulting in a committee left incomplete, at least for day one.
